Course Description

Designed to equip Instructors to deliver training on a variety of arrest and control techniques (ACT) methods. Instruction focuses upon the “KOGA” ACT methods and encompasses training related to prevailing use of force law, methods of instruction (Train the Trainer), law enforcement defensive concepts, civil liability considerations, footwork and balance, and safety management during training. It includes details regarding Use of Force: specifically, Case Law and updated legislative content of Penal Code 18-1-707. Attendees will also learn a variety of specific arrest control methods including cursory searches, standing searches, prone searches, control holds, handcuffing techniques and take down methods.

The class includes a 4-hour lecture on the Koga Method. In addition, a written exam and a physical performance test will be administered on the last day of class. Those who pass both tests will be provided a certificate allowing them to instruct others in the Koga Method.
